Roseville Roundhouse Model Railroad Association Sierra Division NMR (a fifth group - Garden Railways - is considering joining)

Most big manufacturers (located well east of California) do not find it economic to exhibit here. Exhibitors are local hobby shops, local manufacturers and individuals.

We are considering co-locating the NMRA regional convention with one of these conventions. There is considerable merit in having the convention in the same location every year. Signing a five year contract makes for reduced costs - but even signing with one hotel brand - say Marriott - can result in considerable savings, even if you are at different Marriott properties.

"Permanent" convention venues next to Amherst and Trainfest

Co-locating means NMRA insurance will cost a few hundred dollars more, but NMRA local will have to do a lot more marketing to increase attendance and attract more manufacturers.

Also, local RPM groups may be amenable to co-branding.

Paul Weiss raised the question "What is the mission of the convention?" This (Milpitas) convention had 176 in-person and 84 online registrants.

Phil will look at a subcommittee to create a survey of region members.

2025 convention in San Luis Obispo

Daylight presented a convention for SLO

Chip Meriam moved to approve Lou Anderson seconded. SLO convention passed unanimously

Non-Rail

We need to do more in this area.

Unfinished Business

SLO convention status report

over 50 clinic spots filled, 1st section of Amtrak excursion filled, opened 2nd section, 55 registrants so far, over 120 room nights booked, need 200 to meet goals. Virtual reg at a few. For comparison, Techline had about 30 virtual reg at the end of early bird discount in January.

New Business

Future regional conventions discussion:

- Like most regions, our membership has dropped. Under 800 now. Start brainstorming ideas on how to still be able to hold these events.
- After SLO it will go to Rohnert park (RED division) then Sierra.
- Even national is struggling.
- Discussion about eliminating the typical hotel model for conventions.
- Non hotel convention done before by Sierra and it worked.
- Narrow gauge convention in washington was at a convention center with nearby hotels.
 Seemed to work well.
- Virtual is an option to make the changes we need to in person events to keep them viable and recognizing that that may make the events not feasible for some. Virtual allows all members to participate fulfilling mission of the organization.
- What solutions have other regions come up with? Larger events with multiple regions doesnt/hasn't work very well its why PCR and PSR were split.
- Rohnert Park convention
 - Because \$42K on the line for Rohnert park in 2026, are we wise to put that money at risk? Should we decide no hotel as an option?
 - Discussion about rohnert park 2026 contract...do we think we can do it? Can we get enough people to go and stay 3 nights? Estimating 70-60 regular attendees at all the conventions. Need to book 197 room nights. Conservative estimate of only 160 sold, we could lose \$5500.
- Long beach did not meet room nights.
- Techline: 239 room nights sold, so it can be done but rooms were \$130/night.
- Continue with all decisions made to hold Rohnert park convention in a hotel per the proposal
- with an acceptable level of loss. With the attitude that each one could be the last based on level of loss.
- Sacramento might be the area to try to find a non hotel model. Some suggestions were made as a research starting point.
- National is planning a new model ...they are considering fewer days, no hotel as base of organization possibly, not in large metro areas, decouple train show from event, perhaps other changes

Scholarship - did it last year, didn't get a lot of publicity, do we want to do again? No motion made to donate funds to New Tracks Modeling Scholarship fund.

Model RR competition at fresno state again ...holiday layout tours for classrooms prior to their own layout building. Funded by Calif high speed rail.

Rail Pass option is it still available? Yes. We will continue to do \$10 matching for another year at least. Might convert more if we just supplement a regular membership. Prize to members that bring in a member perhaps? Nationally only a 6% conversion rate.

The NMRA's new Medicare health plan that covers NMRA membership. Remind members to look into it.

Highlights:

- 1. Saxon estate has brought in a little over \$5K so far.
- 2. All divisions are meeting regularly. Most have Zoom events also.
- 3. Membership is slightly dropping.
- 4. Train shows are back big time!
- 5. This convention Should at least break even.
- 6. Having Companion free has really helped.
- 7. Election completed Chip will be new PCR President.
- 8. Talking to the National it is confirmed that membership overall has declined but the decline is slowing down.

<u>Changes to Model Railroad Author A.P. Requirements:</u>

Non-published work will now qualify. The work must be acknowledged by an NMRA member and must have been helpful. This requires a witness and is similar to witnessing for, say, the Electrical Engineer certificate.

For printed matter, a single page has been reduced from 1,200 words to 800 words. The reasoning is that many print publications are shrinking in volume and are using larger fonts.

NMRA Branding:

NMRA has engaged FODA (Austin, TX), a branding company, to guide and develop the NMRA brand. Resulting logo(s) and promotional materials will be made available to all regions and divisions via the CANVA platform. As such, divisions and regions must identify a volunteer, within their ranks, to learn CANVA and develop the capability to access and download branding material.

90th Anniversary:

Labor Day weekend 2025 will be the dates for the official celebration of NMRA's 90th Anniversary. Divisions and regions are encouraged to observe the dates and engage in some celebratory activity.

Grouper:

To date, 800 applications have been received and 310 have been approved (38.75%). Participation requires enrollment in Medicare Advantage, which works well in metropolitan areas but not so well in non-metro areas. The subsidy has been increased to \$130 per year per participant, with the money going directly to the participant.

Achievement Program:

In addition to the changes in the Author requirements (discussed above), the Master Builder – Structures category has been modified to include "thin" structures, such as those three-sided, abbreviated structures used along a backdrop.

Also, there is movement towards replacing the qualifying paperwork with an electronic method.

Regional Conventions:

The Lone Star Region has developed permanent convention and registration websites to be used by all divisions as they take their turn hosting.

Several regions expressed a general apathy on the part of their members to actively participate in convention planning and execution. This seems to be a combination of an aging membership base and simple "burn-out."

As a measure to reduce the cost to attendees, several regions are planning to offer shorter conventions--some only two days. Overall cost-savings may accrue by getting away from the convention hotel model.

Insurance:

Providing liability insurance for divisional and regional activities is seen as one of the benefits of NMRA membership. Indeed, the 100% NMRA clubs can take advantage of NMRA insurance coverage, and this is likely a good incentive for the clubs to encourage and maintain 100% NMRA membership.

Daylight Division Annual Board of Directors Meeting Report March 2025



Over the past year, the Daylight Division has adjusted its priorities in response to evolving interests and the effectiveness of previous outreach efforts. This past year the primary focus has been preparing for the upcoming PCR annual convention, *Daylight Limited*.

Membership Recruitment and Outreach

Our emphasis at train shows has shifted. While we previously emphasized recruiting through the Rail Pass program, this approach has been scaled back due to a low conversion rate to full NMRA membership after the nine-month trial period.

A more effective strategy for the division has been direct outreach to potential members through:

- Meet-and-greet events
- Layout tours
- Hands-on workshops (e.g., benchwork, wiring, weathering)

We've also encouraged younger modelers to attend meetings alongside current NMRA members, which has helped build interest and engagement.

Convention Promotion

We promoted the *Daylight Limited* convention at both the Ventura and Bakersfield Train Shows. Most NMRA members we encountered were already aware of the event and had already made their attendance decisions. The most common reason for choosing not to attend was cost—specifically, hotel and registration expenses.

At Bakersfield, many non-NMRA attendees were unfamiliar with the convention. However, our promotional video generated interest and allowed us to explain the value of attending.

Ongoing Activities and Future Plans

Our weekly Tuesday night Zoom meetings continue, although regular attendance has declined somewhat.

Looking ahead, we plan to:

- Increase outreach to unaffiliated and "lone wolf" modelers
- Host more hands-on, skill-focused events across various geographic areas of the division
- Empower local members to organize meetings
 Encourage new members to get involved and connect with others in the division
