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

The following is a succinct recap of my Report to the PCR's BOD held during the past PCR Convention in Rohnert Park, Return to the Redwoods.

The Redwood Empire Division has been active with virtual meetings with Superintendent Paul Weiss reaching out of the Division for presenters so as to offer a more exciting, fresh and stimulating experience. It has been well received and likely will continue as long as we have a virtual component for the meeting. We could set up a virtual presentation during an in-person gathering, partnering with Show and Tell which is still a big factor and well received.

Our Achievement Program is continuing to churn out Certificates of Achievement with excited members getting closer to the ultimate goal of MMR.

Our website has been revamped to maintain a look of professionalism and was well received.

We now have a Facebook page to reach out to the membership and people at large.

Cliff and Denni Baumer, our co-chairs, and their staff worked hard to assure a well run PCR Convention. They fought hard against a lackluster enrollment and cancellations due to family matters and health issues coupled with higher venue and food costs. The lingering specter of Covid 19, the aging of our membership and the "laisses- faire" mentality instilled by the virtual meetings of the past is catching up and will need to be brought up as a discussion by the Board and General Membership to make sure in-person Conventions survive."

The Board had a varied agenda with much discussion surrounding the possible exploration on whether to combine Divisions or even Regions. More on this to come. I welcome any input from the RED membership on this topic as it affects all of us.

Denni Baumer is now the new PCR Convention Chairwoman replacing Tom Crawford who served in the capacity for many years.

Financial reporting of a 501c7 organization:

Divisions (they don't have individual EINs) need to report annually to the Region when the fiscal year ends (March 31). This is not an invasion of privacy but to follow the law. Reports should be done by the end of April and should include gross revenue, expenses and assets.

A proposal was made to have a "permanent" site for Conventions -3 to 5 years-This would allow a relationship with a Hotel. A standing Committee would be formed that remains over the years. Jim Collins and Scott McAllister will look into this and report in October.

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






Sturgeon's Mill


