RED Director's Report

PCR's BOD met virtually, by Zoom, in a special session in January . Three of the four Directors were present together with the President and Vice President while the Sierra Division Director voted by proxy. The topics on the agenda were consideration and discussion of the following motions which had been visited off the record before:

- 1- voting on changing PCR's by-laws allowing the positions of Division Superintendent and Director to be amalgamated into one. The reasoning behind this move was given as a response to the recent and on-going lack of volunteers who apply for the positions and the absence of NMRA's liability coverage for the position of Superintendent. The Board voted unanimously in favor of this change but allowed each Division to make the final decision based on the current potential number of nominations for the positions.
- 2- reversing the Manual of Operations (MANOPS) directives on responsibility for paying the Contest Awards from the Host Convention Committee to PCR's treasury. This move eliminated a grave discrepancy by basically having forced on a subsequent Convention the responsibility to replace the award inventory used up by the previous Convention which varies from Convention to Convention. The timing of this change could not have been more beneficial to RED's Convention efforts in that it frees up monies in the budget to be allocated to other dire needs.

As your Divisional Director, I would like to exhort each and any of you to contact me with any suggestions or comments on issues you feel important and want to be brought up in front of the BOD. The Divisional Director is YOUR voice on the PCR's BOD. Make use of it.

One Last Call/Reminder

To all the great modelers in the RED. Giuseppe Aymar, MMR Division Contest Chair

As we are meeting in person once again, it is now possible to have all those models you have been saving on your shelves to be displayed and even judged at this year's RED Convention "Return to the Redwoods" coming up in April.

Models, Arts & Crafts, photos, modules , even whimsical entries are welcome.

For those who are part of the AP program (or not) who are in pursuit of Merit Awards Certificates, this is a golden opportunity to accumulate as many as you desire. When registering the entries let us know if you want AP judging by itself and not be part of the Contest. (Remember that in this case one would not be given a plaque even if would have won first place or Best in Show. but will receive a Merit Award once the minimum standard is met). Or one can enter both AP judging and Contest in which case one is eligible to be awarded plaques as well.

Additionally one can earn points for volunteering in the Contest room (or elsewhere as needed) and also be a Contest judge, thus earning even more points, together with the knowledge one can glean in the process.

The display tables are also available for the exhibition of models by members who want to "show their stuff" but desire to avoid Contest.

As we are a modeling organization, most of us really enjoy watching the efforts of other modelers pursuing their interests in the hobby. We visit layouts, participate in operations, go to clinics; all that to improve our knowledge of topics obscure or familiar to our interests. I place the Contest/Exhibition Room on a par with all the other activities at the Convention. As we need clinicians and host layout owners we also need Contest Room participants to allow this wonderful activity to flourish and continue to be a vital part of Conventions. The "oohs and aahs" (probably misspelled), heard in the Contest room are the oxygen for this Hobby. One needs to understand that the prolific and ubiquitous acceleration of detailing by the major manufacturers is in direct proportion to the efforts by modelers to improve on basic offerings. It all started by modelers who super-detailed or changed items to meet specific prototypes as faithfully as possible. We owe a great deal to our past pioneers in Contest.



Jim Radkey's BNSF PLSD (Pink Lady Subdivision) Progress Report





Jim was asked to upgrade a very basic brass model of a Pennsylvania X31b freight car by Paul Weiss for use on Paul's Central Vermont layout. The pictures show Jim's detailing of the roof walk, car ends, and underframe. A new Rapido X31a freight car was used for modeling specific details. Additional detailing and weathering was done using acrylics, Bragdon's Adhesive Powders, and Pentel Oil Pastels with referencing Tony Thompson's blog, Modeling the SP. 




Jon Schmidt and Using the Arduino Electronic Prototyping Tools


Jon reviewed two circuits he created, in conjunction with Seth Newman, for Paul Weiss' Central Vermont layout. He showed the Arduino modules for an effect controller and grade crossing controller. The effect controller provides a model railroader with access to a variety of sounds as well as when to start and stop them and the duration of the sound. The grade crossing controller allows a model railroader to control how a crossing signal acts when a train is approaching and leaving a grade crossing.

Ed Merrin Update on his Northwestern Pacific Layout

Ed Merrin could not attend the meeting but provided a video showing his latest projects on his Northwestern Pacific layout. He has upgraded three brass Harriman passenger cars, added industries to his layout and added water to the Petaluma River as it flows through Petaluma. The water project involved working with a craft product called Mod Podge. After preparing the riverbed and river banks, the river bottom was painted with acrylics paint. Mod Podge was then then poured over the acrylic base. When dry, additional acrylic paint was painted over the Mod Podge.

Paul Weiss: Adding Video to a Layout



YouTube provides videos covering every conceivable model railroading topic, including tutorials by many manufacturers. There are many amateur tutorials as well, some better than others, so be prepared to do a bit of searching to find the answer to your question. Hobby Magazines






