Jon Schmidt and Michael Litant discussed their parts in operating Paul Weiss' Central Vermont system. Jon reviewed using the JMRI (JAVA Model Railroad Interface) system capability for scheduling car movements. The layout features about 700 cars in action, dozens of industries and several interchanges with other railroads. Help from a 21st century computer is needed to model the efforts of an army of clerical folks in the 1950's. Michael's follow-on presentation showed how the computer system outputs are converted to switch lists and train crew orders. Not a trivial task either. Not everyone runs their railroad like this, but these were great discussions on how to approach this kind of realism if you like.

We also had our show and tell session by 8 members showing projects and stories of great railroad interest. Discussions of the convention and web site were had. A raffle and lunch completed the day. Make sure

Former Redwood Empire Division member and Pacific Coast Region President Ron Plies passed away in Boise, Idaho, on Saturday, May 31st. He had been in poor health for several years. He had a severe fall several days before he died. Ron was a long-time insurance agent in Fortuna, CA, before he retired. His love was the Southern Pacific RR, and he was a member of the Southern Pacific Historical Society. He built a module of the Port Costa yard and ferry slips where the Southern Pacific crossed the Carquinez Straits to Benicia before the building of the Carquinez Straits railroad bridge was built in 1930. He was Mr. Clean, and he was MMR 409. He was a great friend and I will miss him.


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Show & Tell

Mike Davis - DCC Decoder Installation

Mike Davis installed a dcc sound decoder in a Southern Pacific 2-8-0 brass locomotive and described the challenges with the installation. Mike business, Davis DCC, does DCC installations, repairs and lighting.







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Show & Tell

Rich Mossholder -

Rich Mossholder's show-and-tell was a mission-style depot that he scratch-built. Designing the depot, he used AutoCAD LT 2024 to create the detailed drawings. He then transferred the drawings to his laser cutter and cut out the parts in 1/64" laser board and 1/16" plywood. He assembled the walls, doors, and windows as usual. He painted the model by stippling chalk paint with a stiff brush to give it a stucco finish. He added a full interior, featuring both scratch-built parts and figures. Since this structure will be incorporated with the Rio Chama section of his layout, he added some details and figures that Malcolm Furlow painted.







Tom enjoys building railroad structures, bridges, tunnels, you name it, as much as he enjoys trains themselves. This model is a drawbridge built from a Walther's Cornerstone kit. In fact, this kit is still available on the Walthers website.

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Show & Tell

David Hale - On30 Model Railroading

I chose to model the Petaluma & Haystack RR, the third railroad built in the state. It was built in 1864, and there are only a few hints at its actual history. A penny-pinching steamboat magnate built it, and there are still remains of the wharf on the Petaluma River where his steamboats would unload goods and ship products of the growing city of Petaluma. There is no record of whether the railroad was standard or narrow gauge. Narrow gauge was cheaper to build, appropriate for the stinginess of the builder, so I am modeling the railroad in On30.



I had been away from model railroading for about 50 years, so I am building my modeling skills. I brought a hand-spiked functioning stub switch, appropriate for the era, and both a wooden flat car built from an Evergreen Hill Designs kit and a kit-bashed Bachmann On30 boxcar. The stub switch uses an over-center spring for operation. There are a few online videos available showing how to build them.




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Show & Tell

Dave Grundman - Small Projects for Enjoyment

Over the years, I have collected a number of building kits and have realized that my layout does not have sufficient space for all of the buildings, at least in their original footprint size. I reduced the size of the footprint of some buildings (cut them in half) so that more would fit on my layout.



I took an interest in replicating part of the town on my layout. Many years ago, Sears and other companies sold a line of kit houses. That is, a complete real house that would arrive at your property is several boxes for the DIYer. So, I now have several houses, a gas station and a one room lowa school house complete two outhouses (loved those outhouses on a cold lowa morning). Today, the town has a modern sewer system and many other modern small-town amenities. The house for my show/tell has glass windows (microscope slide covers), door knobs (pin heads) and a screen door (tea bag material).



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


Car Orders on the Central Vermont - A Clerks Eye View Michael Litant

On the Central Vermont Railway in Northern California, train conductors departing East New London (ENL) Yard receive waybills and empty car orders for each car in their train. Car orders for additional pickups en route come from Agents or from locked bill boxes at towns not covered by Agents.

Meanwhile, yard crews at ENL Yard make up and break up departing and arriving throughout the operating session (representing either a day or night shift) from hand-written switchlists.

Bundles of car orders and en route pickups for conductors, and switchlists for yard crews, are put together before—and—during each operating session by the ENL Yard's Clerks' office.


This presentation outlined the operational side of sorting and distributing car orders for the cars moved across the railroad each operating session and developing car location reports and a track assignment form to write switchlists to assemble, classify, and locate the hundreds of cars which occupy ENL Yard, its local industries, and its piers at all times during an operating session.





Managing Car Orders in ENL and Fort Yards



ENL Yard and New Haven Fort Yard both have PICL boards with a slot for each track and location cars can be placed.

As cars come in, go out, and are moved, the car orders are moved to the same locations and listings are updated.

Between sessions, a full inventory is taken; if needed, the listings are again updated..

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

Updates During the Operating Session

Most of the clerks' work can be done in advance of an operating session, but not all.

- Arriving trains need their classification <u>switchlist</u> written in the same order that the cars are in, so that must be done after a train arrives in ENL Yard.
- Classification switchlists for the returning local North and South switching jobs also need to be written in car sequence.
- The ENL Yard Track Assignment form is updated on word from the Yardmaster, who may move cuts of cars or trains to different yard tracks at any time.

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Tom Comyns Draw Bridge

I enjoy railroad structures, bridges, tunnels, you name it, as much as I enjoy trains themselves. This model is a drawbridge built from a Cornerstone kit, made in Denmark. In fact, this kit is still available on he Walthers website. This model is based on a Northern Pacific Bascule Bridge that crosses the Duwamish River in Seattle, Washington. In fact, the bridge is still used today by the BNSF.

I'll have to say, however, this is not the easiest kit I've ever built, and the instructions are somewhat vague. Unfortunately, the instructions lack detail, and a few parts were omitted from both the diagrams and the written steps, making it a bit of a challenge to assemble.



As I assembled the bridge I painted it with flat black Rust-Oleum spray paint. In addition to weathering the bridge, I affixed it to a stand that hid the two 9 V batteries, wired in parallel with a 6 V voltage regulator, so that it could be operable without plugging it in. Look for the bridge installed on a RED members layout in the upcoming 2026 convention.

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Tool Tips

A Tool for Working with LEDs - Jon Schmidt

Here's a simple tool that I use frequently when I'm working with LEDs or lamps. I like to set the brightness at a point less than full light, but selecting the proper resistance is a bit of trial and error.

With this tool I can power up the light and adjust the resistance until I am satisfied. Always start with the pot dial set to the5K ohm mark, and then dial it down. I then use my VOM to see where the potentiometer is set and select a resistor accordingly. The pot in the little case is a 5K ohm potentiometer, 2 watt, RV4NAYSD502A.



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
