

## From the Superintendent

#### Wow, where did the year go?

It really flew by for me! I hope you were able to achieve at least some of your goals in our hobby as well as life in general. I'm thankful for those of you who pitched in to help with our efforts to reach out and provide a good experience for all our members.

As I enter the second and final year of my term as Sierra Division superintendent, I'm happy to have a few items in the plus column. One of my goals at the start of 2023 was to work on growing our membership and we had some pretty good success on that front. In a joint effort with the other three divisions of the <u>Pacific</u>

<u>Coast Region</u> (PCR), we've had a membership information table at several shows from Sacramento to Bakersfield and Pleasanton. Through this effort, we've welcomed close to 50 new members to the region through the NMRA's 9-month "Rail Pass" membership program. If you're one of these new members, I hope that your investment has started to pay you dividends.

Our division stretches from the Oregon border to Modesto and out to the Nevada-Utah border. This is a lot of territory to cover. One of my goals as I assumed office was to improve and streamline the way we got the word out to our members. We migrated the majority of our e-mail contact tasks over to the ConstantContact platform when I took the helm in late 2022. We also moved <u>the Sierra Division's</u> <u>website</u> to a new platform. Our division paymaster Michael Eldridge took over the additional duty of webmaster for both the division and region's websites. On the national level, our parent organization rolled out a new way to connect with members throughout the world of model railroading through the Discord application. I count these moves in the plus column as it has helped us verify, view, and understand how our members are receiving our communications.

Another of my goals was to concentrate our efforts to visit parts of our division that had not been on our itinerary since before COVID. We accomplished this in August by holding our quarterly meeting in Carson City Railroad Association's club and layout. Eight layout owners in the region opened the doors to their layouts for division members to visit. I had hoped to include a visit to the southern part of our division for our final quarterly meeting but due to unforeseen circumstances, we weren't able to make it in 2023. I plan on make up for this shortcoming in 2014.

2023 was our division's turn to host the PCR's annual convention. Chip Meriam and Jim Collins stepped in to share the duty of co-chairmanship for the convention which was co-sponsored by the <u>Feather River Railroad Society</u> after our original chairman moved away to another region. While the convention venue had a few notable limitations it gave many a chance to visit club and home layouts, take a tour of a prototypical railroad locomotive and car builder. The convention also provided region members with opportunities to rekindle friendships, as well as share their knowledge and experiences.

# From the Editor





On May 30, 2023, we lost Mike to cancer. He had just lost his wife Marsha, who died in March. Mike's daughter Courtney Hamm, who lives in the Redding, California area, was with him during his final months and lovingly assisted him until the end.

Mike was a man of gentle spirit, good humor, and many talents. He loved his model railroading hobby, and was a model maker of consummate skill. Mike had been involved in many aspects of model making over the years since boyhood, including building and flying some of the very first radiocontrolled helicopters.

For the past 20 years, Mike and his wife Marsha lived on their beautiful place outside Cottonwood, California. There they grew flowers and vegetables, and planted a large orchard with dozens of fruit bearing trees. They kept chickens and pigeons, and both enjoyed their hobbies - Marsha had a workshop for her sewing and craft projects, and Mike had a large shed devoted to his model railroad setup. It was there that he created the models he featured in his articles for the *Short Line* newsletter. Mike will be missed.





Have you joined the NMRA Interchange? It's the newest tool to help you connect with other members, gain knowledge and learn to modeling techniques. The Interchange is hosted on the Discord application which is available for Windows, Apple OS, Android and Apple devices. See instructions below for signing up.

#### Joining the NMRA Interchange

Have you joined the Interchange yet? If not, follow these steps to get connected!

- 1. Go to nmra.org/nmra-interchange
- 2. It will ask you to log in to the NMRA website if you're not already logged in. If you are not registered with the NMRA website yet, now's the time to do it. Click the "Need a username? Register now" button, and get set up. Use the email address on file in the NMRA membership system (probably the one where you got this eBulle-tin). The system will email you a link to set your password.
- 3. Now you should be in the **<u>NMRA Interchange</u>** page. If not, click this link.
- 4. Click on Member Info in the top right corner and scroll down get your exact Member ID. You'll need that later.
- 5. Read through the page and then follow the "Interchange Server Invite" link at the bottom. This is a special link just for you and will look something like <u>https://discord.gg/xxxxxx</u>
- 6. You will be taken to Discord (the platform that hosts the NMRA Interchange) where you will be prompted to sign in, if you already have an account there, or prompted to register, if not. If you need instructions for creating an account or logging into Discord they can be found <u>here</u>.
- 7. Once you accept the NMRA Interchange Invite, and you are logged in, you will land in **#the-lobby** with a message on what to do next.
- 8. We suggest that you read and agree to the **#rules** first. Just click on **#rules** and then click on "thumbs up". Then click on **#the-lobby** again to do the most important step.
- 9. Discord and the NMRA need to check with each other, in order to verify that you are a current NMRA member with an email on file. You start the process with the **/onboard**command. Now, this is very sensitive to the type of device you are using, so just type the first few letters **/onb** at the bottom where you see a + sign in a circle. It will complete the command for you in a pop-up just above that. Click on the **/onboard**command. Add your membership number (6 characters followed by a space and then two more characters) just as you noted in step 4. Example: /onboard *input:* 123456 0A
- Discord and the NMRA computers will have a chat, and then you will receive an email containing a / clearance command. That's your entry ticket. Copy and paste the whole line into #the-lobby (at the + sign again). Example: /clearance input: 654321
- 11. You're in! You will not have to do any of this again. If anything derails, you'll get a message telling you what to do next, and we also have Moderators in the Interchange standing by to help.
- 12. If all went well, you'll now see more than 350 channels (those # things). We suggest you start by going to **#introduce-yourself** and then scroll up to **#the-workbench** to see what others have done and shared! Then find your Region and Division and say "hello" there. And then start participating and enjoy!










**The Sierra Division, PCR-NMRA** is making available to Sierra Division members a "kit" containing the necessary tools and instructions to complete the part 3 requirements of the NMRA Model Railroad Engineer – Civil Certificate. More information on the requirement is at: www.nmra.org/civil

#### The Kit:

The kit includes tools and templates sufficient to create the following (you only need to construct 3):

- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Right-hand turnout
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Left-hand turnout
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Single crossover
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Double crossover
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Crossing 14 degree

#### How the System Works:

- Reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis. All reservations will be for a calendar month. Requests must be sent to <u>louiesqd@att.net</u>.
- □ The kit will be shipped via UPS on the first day of the month. Arrival should be within 2-3 days.
- □ The member may use the kit for what should be, **about** three weeks.
- The member must ship the kit back, postage pre-paid by the 25th of the month. This will allow us time to check and clean the kit and still send it out again on the first of the month. Zip ties and address information will be included in the kit. Return the kit to:

The rental fee and deposit must be received by the 15th of the preceding month.




