



Promote Our Hobby and Run Trains Shelter Cove Community Church Christmas Program

I have spoken several times at our monthly Zoom meetings and at the latest in-person meeting in August about supporting the Christmas Program at Shelter Cove Community Church in Modesto. They put this on every year and this year they would like to have a Christmas train portion that brings to mind the traditional train-under-the-tree idea although with a Polar Express type theme.

The train club in Denair/Turlock, the San Joaquin Valley Toy Train Operators, Inc. (SJVTTOInc), an all-scale club, has a portable HO-scale layout they operate annually at Stanislaus County Fairgrounds the first weekend in December and at other functions and places in the area. I approached them and this past weekend, they voted to support the effort with the layout and with member help. That was important, obviously.

The dates and times that the trains need to run are the second and third weekends of December (Dec. 11 & 12, and Dec. 18 & 19). The times will be from 6pm – 8pm on Saturdays and from around 8:30am – 1pm on Sundays.

Recently I sent an email to everyone who lived relatively close (anywhere between Denair and Sacramento) asking for volunteers to run trains. So far, two people have replied, one saying he can't make it and one who can. That plus one member who already volunteered and another person from Sacramento Modular Railroad Club plus me are all that have so far volunteered. While there are several from SJVTTOInc, we still need more.

Additionally, what I didn't consider but was pointed out to me this past weekend and is equally important is the disassembly, transport, and reassembly of the layout. The members of SJVTTOInc are, like most of us, getting up there in years. It is a major operation for many of them. The plan is to disassembly the layout from its setup at the Stanislaus Fairgrounds either on the Monday or Tuesday following the show there (either Dec. 6 or 7), transport it to Shelter Cove

Church and reassemble there. Then it will need to be taken down and returned to the club's spaces in Denair again and setup on the Monday or Tuesday after the 3rd weekend of December (either Dec. 20 or 21). We will need help with this also. I will be asking the church for bodies to assist also but it would be good to have people who understand trains, track, wiring, etc. to help. I will be sending a follow-up email about this very soon.

So PLEASE, it is important to promote our hobby and I believe this will be a lot of fun. The people at Shelter Cove are super nice and bending over backwards to accommodate us. They are not hardcore on the times (for example, they realize 8:30am on a Sunday is difficult for many folks) and they have generously opened their small cafeteria up to us for free coffee and snacks.

Assuming the following parameters, we need 24 people to volunteer:

- No one operates more than one day of the two weekend period
- Each "shift" is for two hours (2.5 hours for one shift on Sundays) for a total of six shifts
- There are four people on each shift, two to operate trains and two to watch and interact with folks for an hour and then they swap.

Obviously there will be a few who will volunteer for more than one day, but I don't know how many and it is always better to cover all bases. So far there are 12 people who have volunteered to run trains so we need another 12, if possible and we still need at least 4 or 5 (though the more the merrier and easier) to help with the layout before and after the show.

Operating Sessions PCR 2022



Hi everyone. I'm Doug Smith, and I will be the Operating Sessions Chair for the 2022 PCR Convention. The convention will be April 21-24, 2022.

We are still in the early stages of planning this activity. Actually, we are not 100% sure that operating sessions will happen, but are moving forward assuming that they will. Many things both within and outside of our control need to fall into place. We are working to ensure that we are ready if the rest of the world, at least the northern California part of the world, is ready, too. So with that, let's get started. April 2022 is closer than some of us think!

The first thing that we need is a collection of operating layouts. There are many great layouts within easy driving distance of Rohnert Park. Some layouts have been flourishing recently with time available to their owners. Many new projects completed, but some have not had a train run for a year. It's time to chase out the mice and dust everything off to see what needs to be done. We had 8 layouts open for the 2018 gathering and hope to have at least that many in 2022.

Operating sessions may be limited to smaller groups. I know many layout owners are considering starting sessions again with skeleton crews. Social distancing requirements, vaccinations, and a general level of comfort with others whom you may not know in your home or club are all factors to be handled for each layout. Please keep these and other questions in mind planning your sessions, but start with your best case scenario and be willing to scale back from there if necessary. No decisions have been made yet or requirements set at the convention level.

If you have a layout and are willing to consider hosting an operating session, please get in touch with me. It's actually easier to start with a big list than to try to add layouts later. Not to mention the motivation that a point on the calendar adds to the trips to the layout room. Operating sessions are always a high point of a convention. This is the time to start working towards that goal.

Thanks for considering hosting a session. It will help the whole PCR move towards a more normal place. The convention web site is http://www.pcrnmra.org/conv2022. We'll work the timing for the operating sessions into the schedule posted there. At this time afternoons are preferred but this is flexible.

Please plan on joining the Convention activities. For everything else - stay tuned! Please feel free to contact me with ANY questions.



HO Scale #5, Code 83 Single crossover


HO Scale #5, Code 83 Double crossover

HO Scale #5, Code 83 Crossing 14 degree

How the System Works:

- Reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis. All reservations will be for a calendar month. Requests must be sent to steve@fungusmungusrr.com.
- The kit will be shipped via UPS on the first day of the month. Arrival should be within 2-3 days.
- The member may use the kit for what should be, **about** three weeks.
- The member must ship the kit back, postage pre-paid by the 25th of the month. This will allow us time to check and clean the kit and still send it out again on the first of the month. - The rental fee and deposit must be received by the 15th of the preceding month.
- a. The rental fee for the kit is \$25.00 by separate check. This will cover the cost of shipping the kit to the
- member, cleaning costs and additional packaging as needed.
- b. A deposit in the amount of \$500.00 must be included by **SEPARATE CHECK**. This check will **NOT** be de posited unless the kit is not returned. When the kit is returned, the check will be destroyed.

- Be prepared. Have supplies ready and on-hand in advance of the arrival of the kit. You will need.
 - a. Micro-Engineering Code 83 NON-weathered rail, have extra, I wasted several.
 - b. Small diameter solder.
 - c. Soldering iron, min 35 watts.
