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

For those of you who haven't visited the NMRA's "The Magic of Scale Model Railroading" exhibit at the museum, this is a great opportunity to see it. Former NMRA President and PCR member Charlie Getz played a key role in making this exhibit happen and he has agreed to be available to give a guided tour or two that day as well as answer questions that you might have about the exhibit.

For those not familiar with the museum, it is open to the public from 10 am to 5 pm and is located at 125 I Street Sacramento CA 95814 at the north end of Old Town Sacramento. The museum is designed to be accessible to persons with disabilities. Paid parking is located in a garage across the street and there are several restaurants located within easy walking distance. Car pooling or travel by train is strongly encouraged. The Sacramento Valley Railroad Station is located one block east of the museum and serves Sacramento Regional Transit Light Rail, Amtrak and Capitol Corridor trains.





LAST RUN

Terry Schmidt



Col (Ret) Terry Schmidt died 5 Nov 2022 of heart related issues, in California. Terry was born in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, in 1943 to Howard William Schmidt and Beverley Marion (Wilke) Schmidt. He is survived by his wife, Denise (Welch) Schmidt, in Gold River, California, where they had lived for the past 33 years, and his nieces Dianna Gustafson and Carrie Scholtz, and his sister-inlaw, Bonnie Schmidt, all of Wisconsin.

Terry graduated from the US Air Force Academy in 1966, flew C-130 aircraft in Vietnam, receiving the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Legion of Merit, Defense Superior Service Medal, and the Air Medal. Upon his return, he married Denise Welch in Midland, Texas.

He enjoyed a long and fulfilling military career, first flying C-130s, and later T-49s, accumulating more than 5,000 hours of flight time. He always said one of his most enjoyable postings was as an Exchange Officer to the Royal Australian Air Force, at RAAF Base Richmond, near Sydney, Australia. He went on to attend graduate school at the Air Force Institute of Technology, earning his Mas-


ters Degree in nuclear physics, and was appointed the Director of the McClellan Central Laboratory, Technical Operations Division, at McClellan AFB in Sacramento, which was tasked with monitoring the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, and several classified programs.


He retired from active duty in Sacramento in 1994 and started his business as a computer programmer and consultant for small businesses. He devoted much of his free time to his longtime love of railroads and railroad history and was a Founding Director of the Placerville Sacramento Valley Railroad in Folsom, a nonprofit organization for preserving railroad history by operating a heritage railroad for the public. He was also a longtime board member for the Sacramento Valley Historic Railway (SVHR) in Woodland, at times serving as a Conductor or Brakeman on its tourist railroad that ran between Woodland and Clarksburg and working many years to help restore the historic Woodland Train Depot, built in 1911.

He was very proud of his own model railroad, which was featured on German television and in several German magazines and DVDs. He also was a longtime member of the Carmichael Kiwanis Club, the National Model Railroad Association, and the Air Force Academy Association of Graduates.





The Sierra Division, PCR-NMRA is making available to Sierra Division members a "kit" containing the necessary tools and instructions to complete the part 3 requirements of the NMRA Model Railroad Engineer – Civil Certificate. More information on the requirement is at: www.nmra.org/civil

The Kit:

The kit includes tools and templates sufficient to create the following (you only need to construct 3):

- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Right-hand turnout
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Left-hand turnout
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Single crossover
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Double crossover
- HO Scale #5, Code 83 Crossing 14 degree

How the System Works:

- Reservations are on a first-come, first-served basis. All reservations will be for a calendar month. Requests must be sent to <u>louiesqd@att.net</u>.
- □ The kit will be shipped via UPS on the first day of the month. Arrival should be within 2-3 days.
- □ The member may use the kit for what should be, **about** three weeks.
- □ The member must ship the kit back, postage pre-paid by the 25th of the month. This will allow us time to check and clean the kit and still send it out again on the first of the month. Zip ties and address information will be included in the kit. Return the kit to:

Reservations:

The rental fee and deposit must be received by the 15th of the preceding month.

- The rental fee for the kit is \$25.00 by <u>separate check</u>. This will cover the cost of shipping the kit to the member, cleaning costs and additional packaging as needed.
- A deposit in the amount of \$500.00 must be included by <u>separate check</u>. This check will **NOT** be deposited unless the kit is not returned. When the kit is returned, the check will be destroyed.

Small diameter solder.

Soldering iron, min 35 watts.


